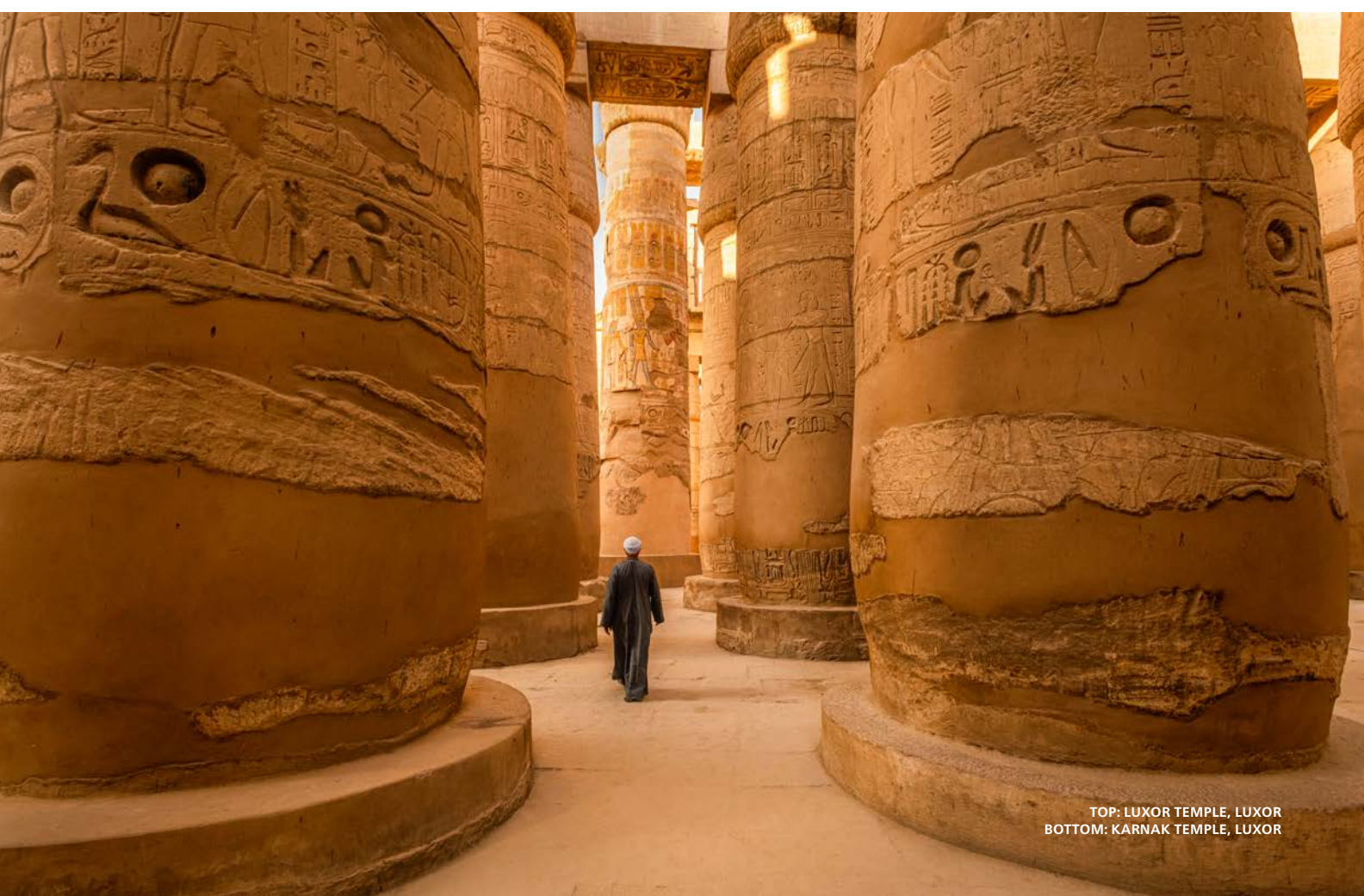


THE PYRAMIDS

Led by an expert Egyptologist, visit the Sakkara Step Pyramid, the oldest stone structure in Egypt, representing a significant milestone in the evolution of pyramid construction. This ancient monument, designed by the architect Imhotep for Pharaoh Djoser, stands as a testament to early Egyptian ingenuity and architectural prowess.

Nearby, on the Giza Plateau, the Great Pyramid of Khufu, the last of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, dominates the landscape. Alongside it are the Pyramids of Khafre and Menkaure, each with their own unique features and historical significance. The Great Sphinx, known as Abu al-Hol, serves as a symbolic guardian of these monumental tombs that have endured for over 4,500 years. Together, these sites form part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Memphis and its Necropolis—the Pyramid Fields from Giza to Dahshur.

LUXOR & KARNAK TEMPLES

Egypt's spiritual capital, Luxor, is an enthralling blend of historic significance, architectural feats and vibrant market culture, characterized by its temples and richly decorated tombs. Often referred to as one of the world's greatest open air museums, historic Luxor, built upon the once-powerful city of UNESCO-listed Thebes, is home to the imposing Temple of Karnak—among the world's largest temple complexes—and the well-preserved Temple of Luxor, a spectacular example of Egyptian architecture.

ABU SIMBEL

Step into Egypt's storied past at the impressive Abu Simbel, where the monolithic temples of Ramses II were constructed in the 13th century BC. Rediscovered in the early 19th century, this UNESCO World Heritage Site was relocated in stages between 1964 and 1968 during the Aswan Dam's construction. Join the optional excursion to marvel at the colossal statues and intricate bas-reliefs depicting Ramses II's victories and divine connections.

VALLEY OF THE KINGS

Situated near Luxor along the Nile, the Valley of the Kings is a renowned ancient burial site for Egypt's pharaohs including Tutankhamen, Ramses IV and Seti I, among others. Dating from the 16th to the 11th centuries BC during the New Kingdom, the royal necropolis features dozens of tombs, intricately adorned with hieroglyphics, carved columns and vibrant wall paintings. Visitors to this UNESCO World Heritage Site can enter various tombs to obtain an immersive look into the rich history and vibrant culture of ancient Egypt.

HOT AIR BALLOON

Experience the breathtaking beauty of Egypt from above as you rise high over the Valley of the Kings in a hot air balloon. Offered as an optional excursion, this early-morning adventure provides stunning views of the sunrise illuminating the ancient landscape. It is a unique and serene way to appreciate the grandeur of Egypt's historic sites.

THE GRAND EGYPTIAN MUSEUM

Located near the iconic pyramids on the Giza Plateau, the newly opened Grand Egyptian Museum spans 120 acres and houses the largest collection of ancient Egyptian artifacts. The complex—two decades in the making and billed as the world’s largest archaeological museum—showcases approximately 100,000 artifacts, including the 3,200-year-old statue of Ramses II. King Tutankhamen’s gold mask and sarcophagus are the crown jewels of the permanent exhibit of treasures from the boy-king’s tomb. A visit to the Grand Egyptian Museum promises an unparalleled journey through Egypt’s rich history.

COPTIC CAIRO

Discover the rich heritage of Coptic Cairo. This historic area is home to some of the oldest churches in Egypt, including the Hanging Church, the Church of St. George and the Church of St. Sergius and Bacchus. Wander through the narrow streets, explore ancient religious sites and learn about the significant role of Coptic Christians in Egypt’s history.



NUBIAN VILLAGE

NUBIAN VILLAGE & SCHOOL

Explore a local village with your guide and meet a traditional Nubian family. Discover their way of life and gain insight into the customs that have been preserved for thousands of years. You will also have the opportunity to visit a village school and engage with the lively children in their classroom.

ASWAN DAM

The Aswan Dam, built in the 1960s, stands as a remarkable feat of engineering that protects the Nile's fertile lands. Controlling the river's flow, it has transformed Egypt's agriculture by preventing devastating flooding and ensuring consistent irrigation. The dam also established Lake Nasser, a vast reservoir stretching more than 300 miles, which provides essential water, electricity and irrigation throughout Egypt.

The Enduring Nile

A voyage along the fabled Nile River
uncovers Egypt's ancient history

The world's longest and greatest river, the Nile radiates a mythic quality, packing centuries of history into each of its meandering bends. This mighty, deep blue waterway is often referred to as the lifeblood of Egypt—ancient civilizations used it as a natural barrier against foreign invaders, a vital trade route between north and south, a powerful economic source of sustenance and a place of hushed worship. Sailing along this legendary river provides ample opportunity to take in the country's major cities and ancient tombs and temples—relics of a bygone past that once unfolded along its palm-fringed banks thousands of years ago.

Although the Nile is most famously associated with Egypt, it flows northerly through or along the border of ten other countries in northwest Africa and empties into the Mediterranean Sea, 4,132 miles (6,650 km) to the north of its origin point. The Nile is a result of the merging of two tributaries: the White Nile originates at Lake Victoria in Tanzania and flows through the narrow gorge of Murchison Falls before reaching Khartoum, Sudan, where it joins with the Blue Nile that rises from a spring far above sea level in Ethiopia.

LUXOR TEMPLE, LUXOR

The first cruise to set sail here occurred in the early 1870s when Thomas Cook & Son built a fleet of steamships that transported wealthy travelers between Cairo and Aswan. To this day, the Nile offers a most spectacular route, sailing close to cultural treasures that recount centuries of history akin to turning the pages of a history book.

While tourism plays a significant role in the Nile's modern identity, its banks are more than ornamental. Thanks to the nutrient-rich soil deposited by annual floods, they remain crucial to Egypt's vibrant agricultural and fishing industries. As a result, almost all Egyptians reside close to the river, and part of the pleasure of sailing the Nile is immersing oneself in the rhythm of everyday life along its shores.

Exploring Egypt is a journey of contrasts. Cairo, Egypt's vibrant capital city, is a bustling metropolis compared to the country's quaint Nubian villages. The ancient pyramids at Giza stand

side-by-side with the newly built, state-of-the-art Grand Egyptian Museum, housing approximately 100,000 ancient artifacts. And the Nile's lush and verdant riverbanks are juxtaposed with its sand-covered landscapes leading to golden-hued mountains.

Discover Luxor, previously known as Thebes, which many historians consider to be one of the world's greatest open air museums due to the scale and magnificence of the mudbrick relics that have remained intact since the 18th to 20th pharaonic dynasties. The Temples of Luxor and Karnak on the city's east bank are among the world's largest and most impressive ancient temple complexes, with their 21-foot-tall columns and majestic, sphinx-lined avenue. In the hills across the river, Ancient Egyptians constructed royal tombs dedicated to Egypt's great pharaohs, with the most famous being that of the boy-king Tutankhamen. Known today as the Valley of the Kings, this necropolis combined with Ancient Thebes, is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Continue sailing as Egypt's dramatic historic sites give way to scenes of everyday life along the Nile. Watch as fishermen in white cotton robes hum excitedly over a bounty of silverfish and water buffalo cool themselves in the arid heat. See farmers and their ox-drawn plows working in crop fields while traditional *feluccas* with their cream-colored sails billow in the warm breeze. In the distance, the hazy backdrop of honey-colored limestone cliffs contrasts with the verdant fertility of the Nile's plant-rich shores.

Qena is the gateway to the magnificent ruins of the Dendera Temple, located on the Nile's west bank. Admire its hieroglyphic-adorned crypts and columns, which are some of Egypt's best-preserved structures, as well as its many examples of Ptolemaic Egyptian art. Enjoy an exhilarating morning of spectacular sunrise views as you float high above the Valley of the Kings in a hot air balloon.

Traveling further along the riverbank lies the town of Esna. Its glorious Temple of Khnum is celebrated for its 1st-century Roman Hypostyle Hall, with 24 columns awash with mysteriously chiseled floral capitals in the form of palm leaves, lotus buds and papyrus fans.

An important port on the northern end of the First Cataract, Aswan is a gateway to experiencing the real Egypt. In ancient times it was a garrison town for military campaigns against Nubia. Today, the riverbank still buzzes with city life, and further along the water's edge, the landscape gives way to sleepy, sorbet-colored Nubian villages dotted

with street murals and fragrant markets that are piled high with colorful spices, dried fruits and wooden crafts. It is an ideal place to learn about local culture by spending time with Nubian families and visiting local schools.

The Nile and its many archaeological wonders are a year-round destination for history lovers. Discovering the secrets of this ancient world is an unforgettable deep dive into how one of history's greatest civilizations came to life, with the Nile at the beating heart of its golden past.

Then, tour the Citadel of Saladin, perched on a rocky hill, followed by time to discover the Mosque of Muhammad Ali. This evening, consider an optional guided visit to experience a kaleidoscope of sights, sounds and scents at Khan el-Khalili, Cairo's centuries-old souk, followed by a traditional dinner.

Today you travel to the Giza Plateau. Begin with a visit to the newly opened Grand Egyptian Museum to admire its impressive collection of artifacts, including items from the tomb of King Tutankhamen. LUXOR'S TIMELESS CHARMS

Journey to the Nile's west bank to explore the Valley of the Kings, where ancient pharaohs were entombed deep in the hillsides. Today, you can visit several sites, such as the tomb of Tutankhamen (discovered in 1922), Ramses IV and Seti I, among the dozens found within the royal necropolis. Then, venture to the Valley of the Queens to discover the grandeur of the Mortuary Temple of Hatshepsut, one of the world's most remarkable architectural feats. After a day of exploration, return to your ship, which is docked in the center of town.

ESNA

Explore Esna and its temple, dedicated to the god Khnum. Admire its intricate carvings, towering columns, ancient hieroglyphics and its well-preserved Hypostyle Hall. Later, take a guided walking tour through the town. See its 19th-century houses with elaborate *mashrabiya* and stroll the lively covered market. Rest well tonight, as Aswan awaits.

ASWAN'S ENIGMATIC BEAUTY

Today's excursion offers a variety of experiences including a tour to the Aswan Dam, a market visit and a ride in a traditional *felucca* along the Nile. Or you can choose an optional tour of the Abu Simbel temples, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that is dominated by four colossal statues of Ramses II. Constructed in the 13th century BC and rediscovered in the 19th century, it was relocated from its original location in 1968 during the construction of the Aswan Dam. Enjoy a relaxing evening on board.

MYSTICAL ENCOUNTERS IN ASWAN

Traverse the Nile by boat to visit a traditional Nubian village. Learn about their culture and lifestyle, and spend time engaging with children at a local school. Then, journey to Agilkia Island to visit the enchanting Philae Temple built to honor Isis. This afternoon, walk right off your ship to explore Kom Ombo, a dual temple dedicated to the gods Sobek and Horus. Return to your ship for an evening at leisure.

EDFU'S ANCIENT SPLENDOR

Your day is highlighted by a visit to the well-preserved Edfu Temple, dedicated to the falcon god Horus. Inside, stroll the colonnaded courtyard, view the hieroglyphics and admire the rows of lotus columns. Later, unwind with a cocktail on the Sun Deck, then make sure your bags are packed as you prepare for your return to Cairo. After dinner, enjoy your last night on board.



OLD CAIRO

DAY 11

RETURN TO CAIRO

Disembark, fly back to Cairo and check in to your hotel. You have the day at leisure to explore more of Cairo on your own. Or consider an optional tour to discover the winding alleys of Old Cairo and the Coptic Quarter, a UNESCO Site, or a tour to browse exhibits at the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization.

DAY 12

DEPART CAIRO

As your journey ends, bid farewell to your fellow travelers and head home or extend your stay abroad with one of our land extension programs.

JORDAN

Extend your journey with 4 nights in Jordan. Marvel at the Roman ruins in Jerash, an ancient city with well-preserved theaters, temples and colonnaded streets. Visit the Crusader-era castle at Shobak, a fortress with a rich history. Uncover the wonders of Madaba, known as the “City of Mosaics,” and explore Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site renowned for its rock-cut architecture and stunning landscapes.

DAY 1 *Cairo & Dead Sea*

Check out of your Cairo hotel and transfer to the airport for your flight to Amman. Upon arrival, drive through rolling hills and spectacular scenery before a guided tour of the Dead Sea Museum to learn about the area’s geological and cultural history. Transfer to your hotel along the shores of the Dead Sea and spend the remainder of the day relaxing; perhaps take a dip in the Dead Sea and experience the floating sensation for which it is renowned. Its mineral-rich waters have been enjoyed for centuries. (D)

DAY 2 *Petra*

After breakfast, check out of your hotel, then head to Mt. Nebo—where tradition tells us Moses was buried—before continuing to the ancient town of Madaba, known as the “City of Mosaics,” for a guided tour. See the Madaba Map in the Byzantine church of St. George, the oldest cartographic depiction of the Holy Land. After a tasty local lunch, journey to Petra, pausing to see Shobak Castle, built by the Crusader King Baldwin I in 1115. Arrive in Petra and check in to your hotel. (B, L, D)

DAY 3 *Petra*

This morning, enjoy a half-day tour of Petra, carved by the Nabateans into the rose-red Sharah Mountains. Walk through the Siq, a narrow fissure between cliffs, to visit Al Khazneh (the Treasury), the Roman amphitheater cut into the hillside, the monastery and other monuments. Before dinner, enjoy free time to explore more of Petra on your own. This evening, you may join an optional tour to experience the hospitality of a local family and a traditional Jordanian meal at their residence. (B)

DAY 4 *Jerash & Amman*

After breakfast, check out of your hotel and travel to Jerash, an ethnically diverse city and one of the best-preserved Greco-Roman cities in the world. Enjoy a guided visit of the “Pompei of the Middle East,” then continue to Amman and check in to your hotel. After a brief orientation tour, spend the remainder of the afternoon at your leisure to explore Jordan’s capital city on your own. 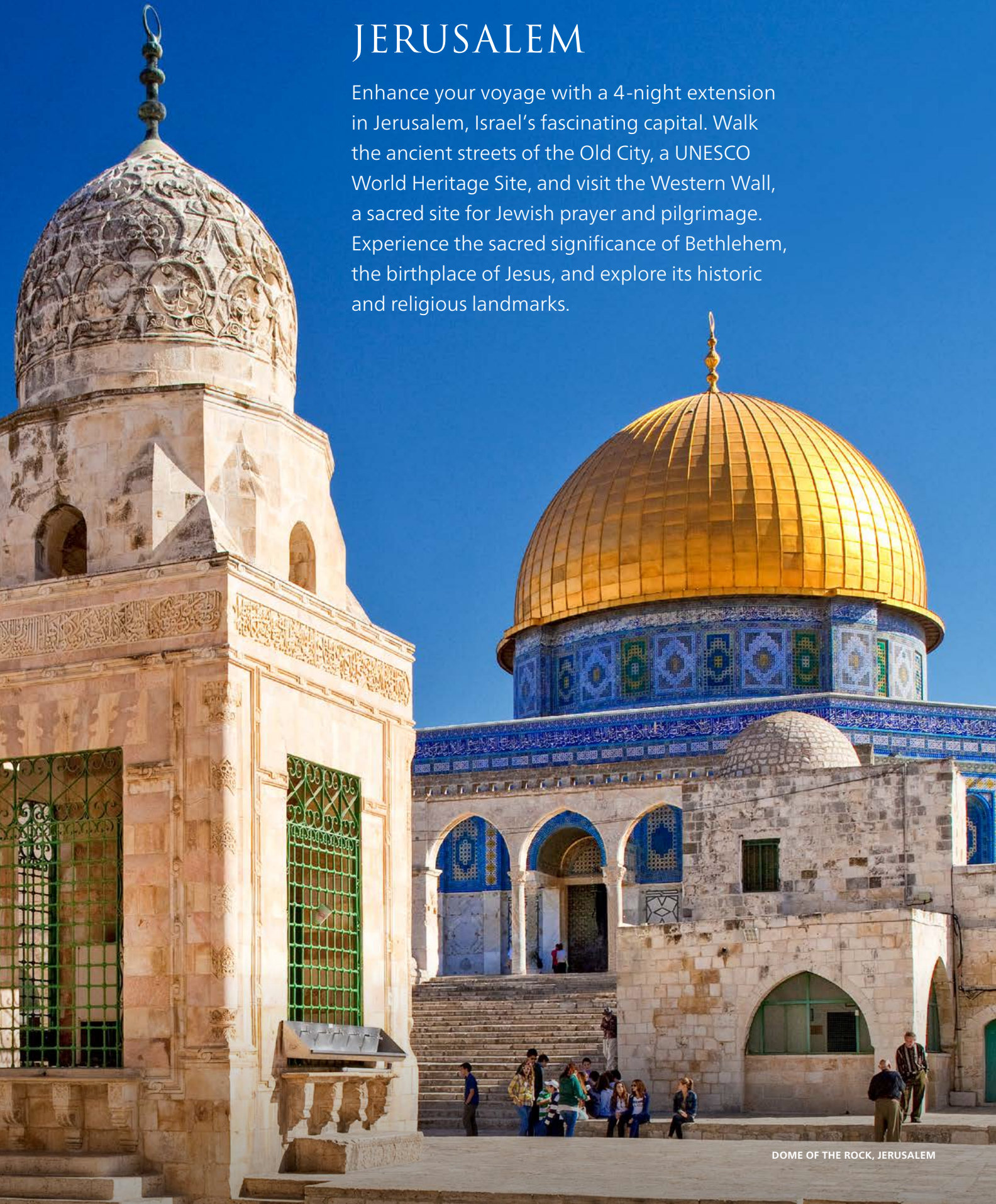

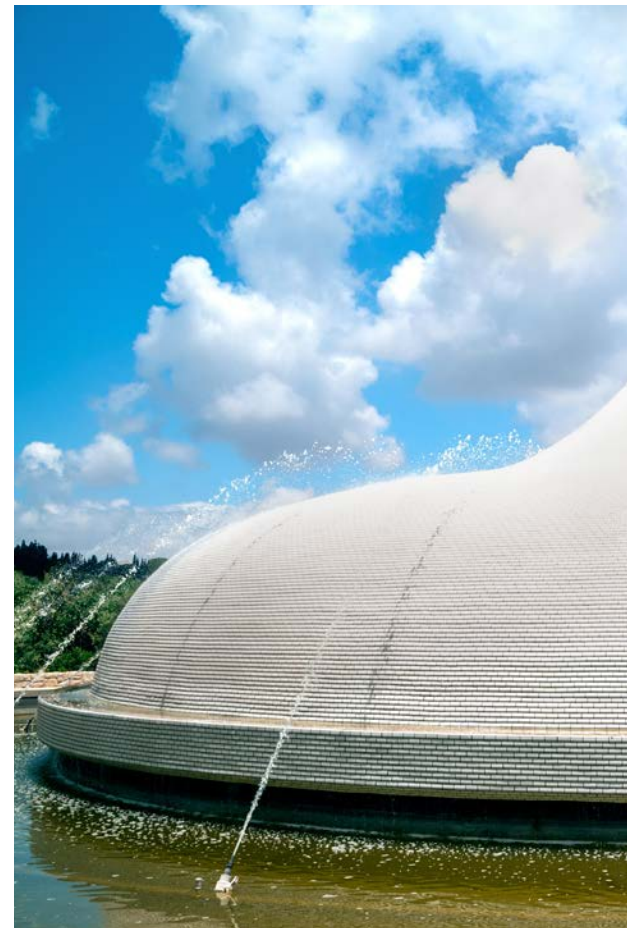

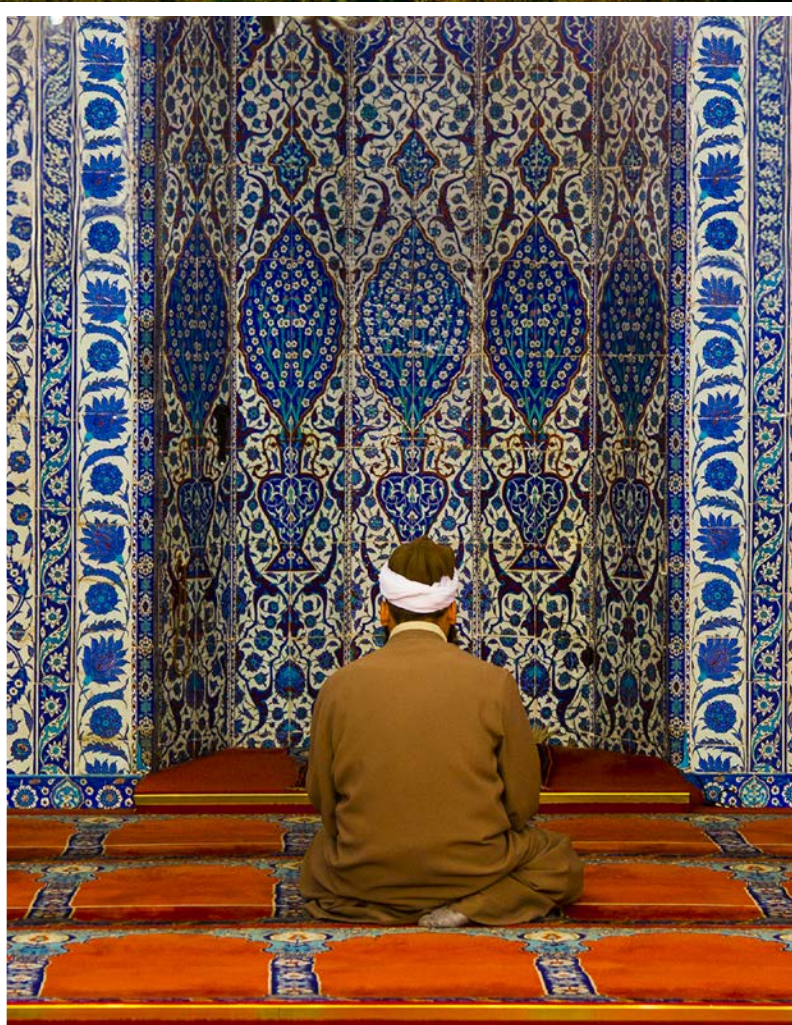

THE 5TH EARL OF CARNARVON'S *Photography Collection*

On November 4, 1922, the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamen by the 5th Earl of Carnarvon and Howard Carter was considered the first global media event and has provided a legacy of understanding, knowledge and insight into a remarkable civilization. Among many talents, the 5th Earl was an avid amateur photographer with an artistic eye for composition. His photographs are at Highclere Castle in Hampshire, England stored in photo albums in the library, and show the process of discovering and excavating the tomb of Tutankhamen, as well as scenes of daily life in Egypt during this period.

With kind permission, George Herbert, the 8th Earl of Carnarvon, who is a longtime close friend of Viking and the godfather of the *Viking Osiris*, has allowed us to share this private collection for guests sailing on board "his ship," as well as its identical sister ships. These images were carefully selected by the designer and godfather of the *Viking Aton*, Richard Riveire, to complement the light-filled interiors of this vessel and highlight destinations along the Nile.

Conjure up in your mind's eye an image of a cruise ship's captain. Tall? Possibly. Male? Perhaps. A neatly pressed uniform with a glitter of gold braid, as befits his rank? An unmistakable air of authority as he strolls the bridge, in calm command of his vessel? Well, the fabulously named Captain Abdel Fattah Muhammad Khalil Abbas Abu Shouq fits none of these stereotypes—other than being male.

The vessel he commands is the *Viking Aton*, one of the newest Viking river ships sailing the Nile River between Luxor and Aswan. His beard—now turned white—and the turban on his head frame sharp, coal-black eyes that constantly monitor his ship and the river it sails on. He wears a traditional Egyptian *galabia*, which flutters and flows behind him in the wind. High up on his forehead sits a dark, bruise-like stain, a sign of religious devotion, caused by decades of praying five times a day.

Few people alive know this river better than him, with its constantly shifting sandbanks and currents. He has been sailing on it since he was six years old. When I spoke to him (through a translator), he told me about his father, older brother and their *felucca* sailboat, and how together, they transported cargoes of traditional ceramic water containers from the north of Egypt and delivered them along the Nile.

And years later, after getting qualified, completing his military service and marrying a wife chosen by his family, he was offered a job as an assistant captain on an Italian river cruise ship. And now, at age 69, he has spent more than 40 years sailing river cruise ships up and down the Nile.

I am curious to know about the difficulties of navigating a ship on the Nile and so he tells me about the high and low water levels, depending on the season. Of hidden rocks, whose position has to be memorized, of sediment deposits and sandbanks that appear and disappear. And of the winds and the currents that can push a ship this way and that.

Navigating the Nile is not easy, so at the start of every season he sails alone, in a small *felucca*, from Luxor to Aswan to inspect the river for himself, leaning over the side of his boat with a long stick, testing the depths of water. Skillfully combining the cutting-edge technological equipment you would expect to find on a modern just-built ship with his decades of experience and intricate knowledge of the river, Captain Abdel proudly guides the *Viking Aton* safely and efficiently along the legendary Nile.

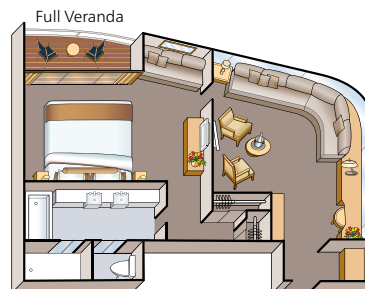

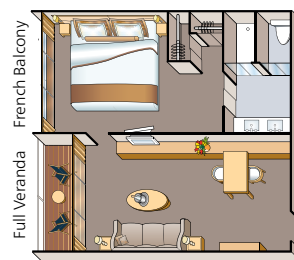

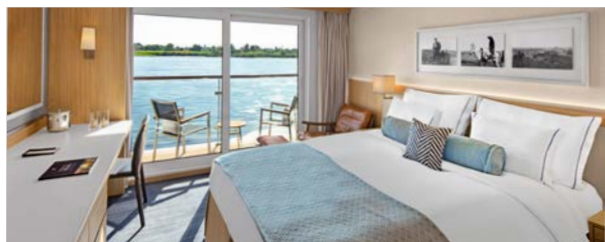

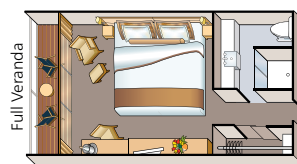

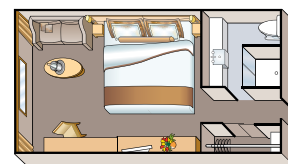

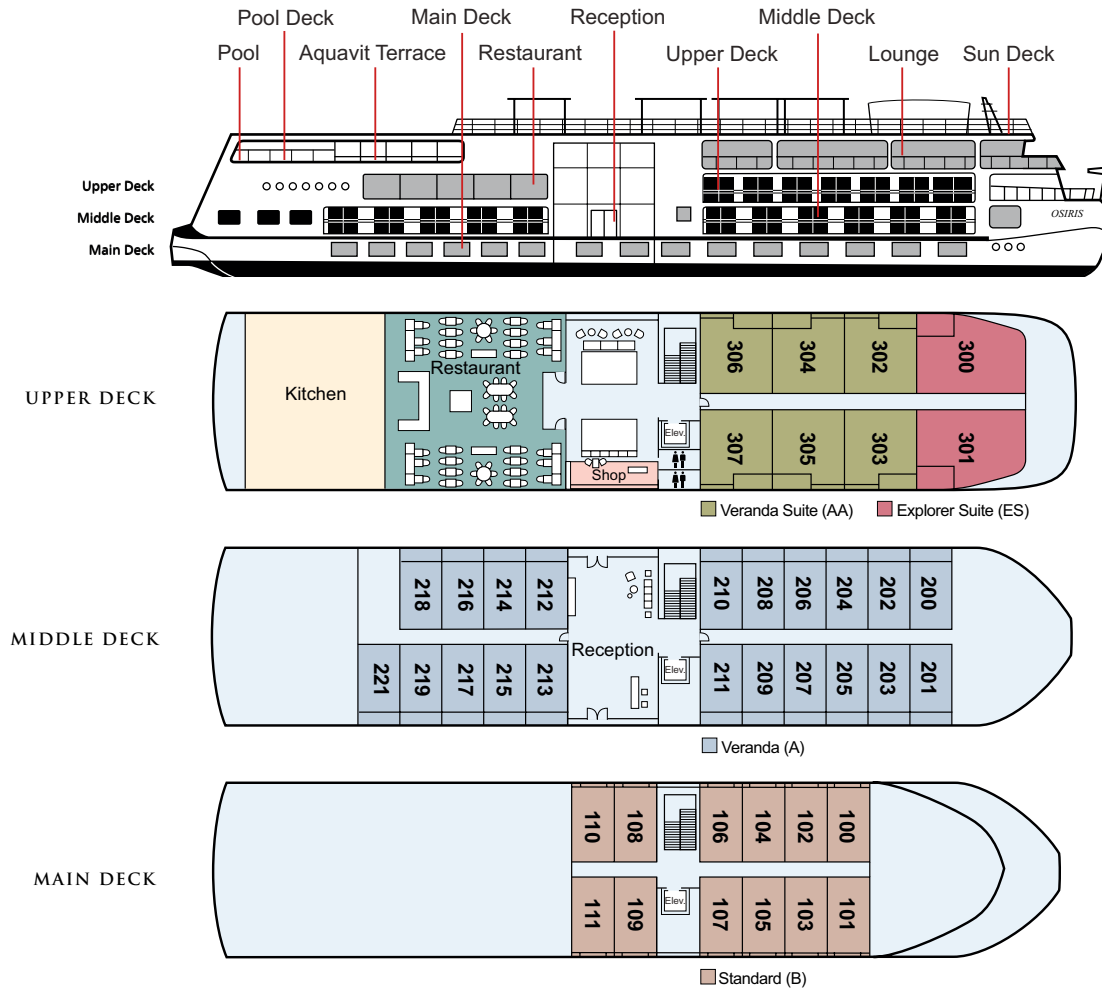
